- Endicott iDistrict Downtown and Neighborhood Revitalization Plan


The Transform Greater Binghamton Program

The program has \$20 million earmarked for three Southern Tier incentives:

- 1) Commercial & Mixed-Use Property Revitalization
- 2) Streetscape & Walkability Improvement
- 3) iDistrict Housing Rehabilitation

- Improved safety and security with decreased code violations

- Elimination of blight through rehabilitation, new construction or in-fill construction



A Model for Environmental Remediation

In 2004, IBM committed to reducing the mass of dissolved TCE in the offsite groundwater plume by 80% within 10 years. By 2012, two years ahead of schedule, it accomplished that goal. In 2015, the Department of Environmental Conservation reported a **98% reduction** from 2004 levels.


